1. DepEd Order No. 37, s. 2015 also known as the **Comprehensive Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) in Basic Education Framework** guides DRRM efforts in the basic education sector towards resilience-building in offices and schools to ensure that quality education is continuously provided and prioritized even during disasters and/or emergencies. The Framework shall institutionalize DRRM structures, systems, protocols and practices in DepEd offices and schools. Further, it shall provide common understanding and language in the implementation of DRRM in basic education at all levels.

The Schools Division of Negros Oriental through Disaster Risk Reduction and Management will conduct **PROJECT MASK VALIDATION OF ONLINE DATA ENTRIES** on February 23-25, 2021 at the venue to be announced later. The assessed areas were rated as having low, moderate, high or very high (critical) susceptibility to landslide. The same areas were also evaluated and rated as low, moderate or high susceptibility to flooding .

The landslide susceptibility rating parameters are as follows:

VERY HIGH: Areas usually with steep to very steep slopes and underlain by weak materials. Recent landslides, escarpments and tension cracks are present. Human initiated effects could be an aggravating factor.

HIGH: Areas usually with steep to very steep slopes and underlain by weak materials. Areas with numerous old/inactive landslides.

MODERATE: Areas with moderately steep slopes. Soil creep and other indications for possible landslide occurrence are present.

LOW: Gently sloping areas with no identified landslides.
