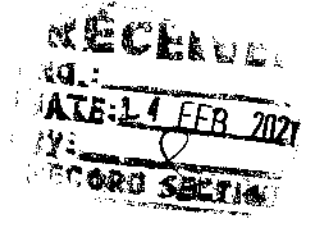


This activity involves your teachers especially those handling Araling Panlipunan subject or any equivalent.




